

## Hayom Yom: 28 Adar II

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הַרְחָמֵן דְּבִרִית מִלָּה - אֹמְרִים.

[The six stanzas beginning] HaRachaman<sup>1</sup> are recited [at the Grace after Meals] following a circumcision.

(מְשִׁיחָה בְּסֵעוּדַת בְּרִית מִלָּה): בְּבִרִית מִלָּה אֹמְרִים כָּשֶׁם שֶׁנִּכְנַס לְבְרִית כֵּן יִכְנַס לְתוֹרָה וּלְחוּפָה וּלְמַעֲשִׂים טוֹבִים. וְנוֹהֲגִים אֶצְלָנוּ, אִזּוּ מֵעַן גִּיט דְּמֵי קְדִימָה אִזּוּ דְעַר אֵינְגַעַל זָאָל לְעֶרְנֶעֶן – (וְנִתֵּן כְּבוֹד קְדוּשַׁת אֲדָמוֹ"ר שְׁלִיט"א סְכוּם מְסוּיָם בְּאִמְרוֹ): – דָּאָס אִיז פֿאַר דְעַר יִשִּׁיבָה.

[The Rebbe Rayatz] said the following at a festive meal celebrating a circumcision:

“At a bris, the wording of the blessing offered by those present is: ‘Just as he has entered the Covenant, so may he enter into Torah [study], into marriage, and into good deeds.’<sup>2</sup> [He then added:] “Our custom is to make a deposit [toward the child’s future tuition fees] – so that he should become a Torah scholar.”

[The Rebbe Rayatz] then took out a certain sum of money and said: “This is for the yeshivah.”<sup>3</sup>

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
